Greenery and Popcorn Fundraisers

We're coming down the stretch!! The time for sales is drawing to a close and it is time to get credit for all your great work. Here are some important events over the next several days. Details are in the *Read This First* document you received in the sales package, also found on the web site.

- ⇒ Complete the 2016 sales spreadsheet and forward via electronic submission to your Patrol leader. (These are the 'old' patrol leaders, not the newly elected ones) It is found on the Troop 91 Web site, in the Greenery and Popcorn section, and is labeled Greenery Sales Spreadsheet. Forward this to your Patrol leader by October 17th.
- ⇒ Take your collection envelope to your Patrol leader. It should contain all money, checks, IOU's, direct delivery information. This is due on Monday, October 17th.
- ⇒ Patrol Leader training on October 17th at the PLC. Steve King will train the Patrol Leaders on their role in collection and verification of the Scout submissions. These are the 'old' patrol leaders, not those recently elected.

Here are some key dates and actions for the Greenery Program. These dates are subject to change pending receipt of Sales Materials from Sherwood Forest Farms.

October 17	Due date for electronic submission of the Scout Greenery Sales Spreadsheet and to turn in all money, checks IOU's etc.
October 17	Patrol Leaders training on their role in the collection and verification of Scout Sales data.
October 23	The second of two sales dates at Village Presbyterian Church. An e-mail with specifics about time, location, attire, etc. will be sent to Scouts working this Sunday

October 24	Patrol leaders will submit the entire patrol order and money to the Greenery Coordinators by this date. Patrol Leaders are to reconcile all orders and money from scouts in their patrol.
November 18 (approximately)	Holiday Evergreens are expected to be delivered and readied for pick up.
November 20 & November 27	Deliveries at Village Presbyterian Church. If you were chosen in the lottery, you must help deliver.

Some Scouts choose to sell Trail's End popcorn instead of or in addition to greenery. Commissions are based on total combined sales of greenery and popcorn.

Trail's End popcorn orders are due to your patrol leader on or before Monday, October 17. The turnaround time for patrol leaders to hand in patrol orders is quite short so please respect this deadline! Remember to collect money in a separate envelope from greenery money.

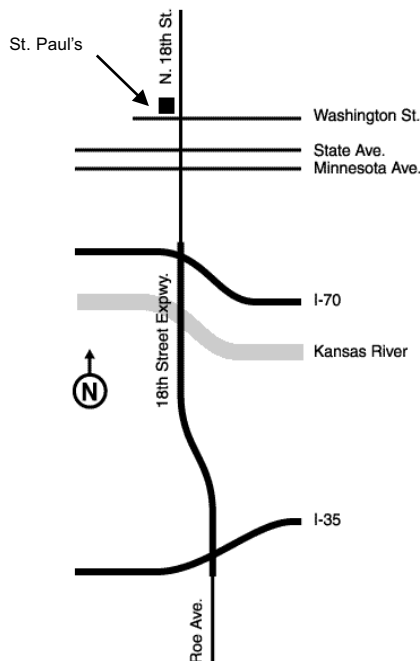

Breakfast at St. Paul's has been going on for more than 10 years every Saturday at 9:30 a.m. week in and week out. More than 200 Kansas City residents come to the parish to eat a breakfast provided by volunteers.

Shift One: 7:15 to 9:30 AM We just need 5 adults or older Scouts to fill the shift. Scouts will prepare and set up a nutritious home-cooked breakfast. Duties include cooking pancakes and potatoes and cutting up and cooking breakfast meat. Adults will need to do any jobs that require knives or actual cooking or baking.

Shift Two: 9:15 to 11:15 AM We need 15-20 volunteers to fill the shift. Scouts should wear their Class A Uniform when serving. The doors open to the neighbors at 9:30 a.m. to serve breakfast. The Boy Scouts will do some of the jobs to get ready for the breakfast, such as setting up the parish hall, making orange juice, bagging the donated Panera bread, etc. After all prepping, the Scouts will be serving, busing tables, cleaning, helping wash dishes, sweeping, mopping, greeting and counting guests.

Directions: St. Paul's is located at 1300 N. on 18th Street in Kansas City, KS, just over 1 mile North of I-70 Hwy.

Parking: Make a left onto Washington St. The church will be on your right (North). Park on Washington Street or in the grassy area on the South side of the church. If both areas are full, follow the alley (West side of church) to the North side of the church and park in the grassy areas found there.

ALL volunteers will enter the building on the WEST side (off the rear alley), NOT the front of the church.

Please enter through the red door. Knock on the door, if locked. Please do not ring the doorbell. The bell is for the meeting in the basement.
